

# APRIL 1ST IS CENSUS DAY



## Seasonal Residents, Out-of-State Students, Temporary Residents What You Need to Know About the 2010 Census

Census Day is April 1, 2010. Census forms will be mailed out in March. It doesn't matter if you spend part of each year in Michigan, Montreal, Martinique or Montevideo; you need to be counted in Florida.

### Seasonal Residents

Decide on your "usual" address. People who live at more than one residence will be counted at the place where they live most of the year. People without a usual residence will be counted where they are staying on Census Day. By choosing Broward County as your "usual" address, Broward County will be able to continue to provide the many services and programs you enjoy today.

### Students

The Census Bureau counts students, whether they are in-state or out-of-state, where they attend their college or university. Students living at their parental home while attending college/university should be counted on their parental census form.

### Foreign Citizens

Citizens of foreign countries who have an established household or are part of an established household in the U.S. — including family members — should be counted at their U.S. home.

### Children in joint custody

Children are counted at the residence where they live most of the time. If time is equally divided, they are counted where they are staying on Census Day.
