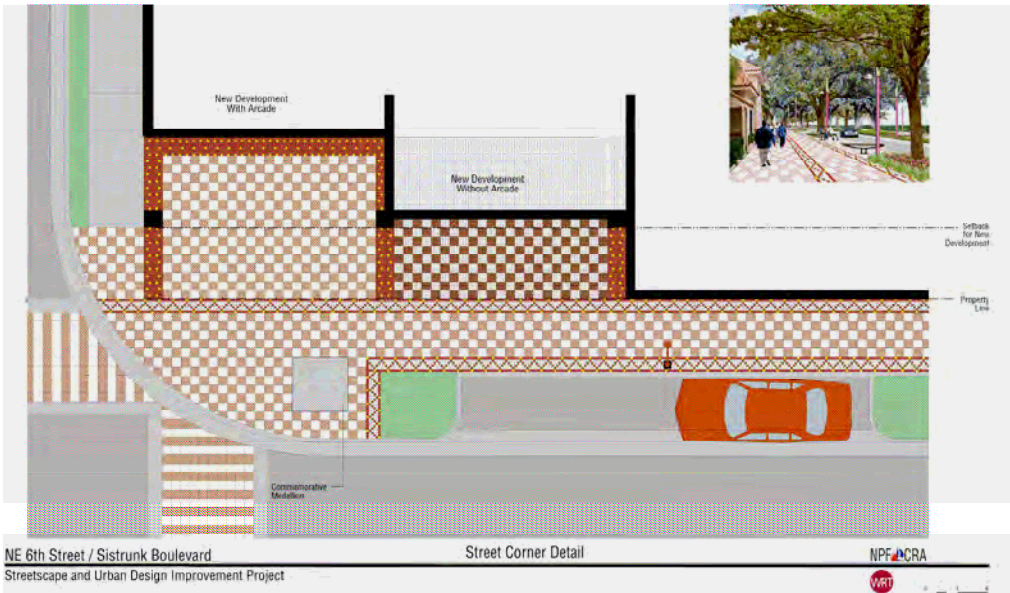


NE/NW 6 STREET (SISTRUNK BOULEVARD) STREETScape AND ENHANCEMENT PROJECT



Project Scope and Summary

NE/NW 6 Street Sistrunk Blvd Streetscape and Enhancement Project extend along Sistrunk Blvd from Federal Highway (US-1) to Northwest 24th Avenue (City Limit). This project is an infrastructure, streetscape enhancement and community redevelopment project designed to improve the quality of life, stimulate economic growth and create a pedestrian friendly environment to access the transit system.

The project design was initiated with the major goals of stimulate the redevelopment and economic growth along the historic commercial district within the "Sistrunk Community" and create a pedestrian friendly environment to access the commercial district and the transit system. The project consists of construction of wide sidewalks, tree planning and creation of landscaping areas, modification of the roadway and the travel lanes, installation of on street parking, modifying the traffic signs and signals, installation of lighting, enhanced bus shelters and bus bays. The design and construction documents for the redevelopment of the newly configured Sistrunk Boulevard have been completed embracing the Livable Community Standards and the institution of Traffic Calming Elements.

This project is a corridor preservation activity necessary to implement transit-oriented improvements, traffic calming measures, and other improvements to transportation system necessary for the community, and system preservation.

Project Support

The final roadway design concept for NE/NW 6 Street/Sistrunk Boulevard was approved by the City of Fort Lauderdale and Broward County Commissions. As a result of these actions a Road Transfer Agreement was approved by both agencies transferring the jurisdiction of this roadway from the Broward County to the City of Fort Lauderdale.

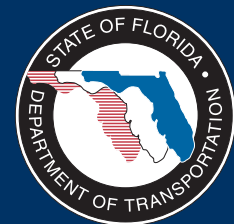
