



South Middle River Civic Association



The South Middle River neighborhood is one of the largest in the City of Fort Lauderdale. This neighborhood sits within the boundaries of the South Fork Middle River, Sunrise Boulevard, N.W. 9th Avenue/Powerline Road, and N.E. 4th Avenue/Flying L Drive.

The South Middle River Civic Association (SMRCA) was created in 1987 and, in 2012, SMRCA celebrated its 25-year anniversary. The association is very active and consists of members who regularly engage in their community. In 2003, SMRCA adopted N.E./N.W. 13th Street between N.E. 4th and N.W. 9th Avenue. This street is a primary east/west corridor between N.W. 9th Avenue and Federal Highway, and it is heavily traveled.

Since adopting this street, a very dedicated group of volunteers have continued to remove litter from it four times per year. During each cleanup event, volunteers collect just over 100 pounds of litter, with about 30 percent consisting of recyclable materials.

The SMRCA Adopt-A-Street volunteers give unselfishly of their time to help keep their neighborhood and their City clean. Their efforts have made a very positive impact on the appearance of their neighborhood.
